# A message from our Headteacher

This has been an incredible year for Ellesmere Park. Following the disturbances caused by the Covid pandemic, we were concerned that our children might struggle to get back into the swing of full time school: how wrong we were! They have been brilliant. Their constant energy, enthusiasm and kindness never fails to make me grateful for my being able to be a part of this vibrant and exciting community.

We set out to do three things this year, help our children get 'back on track', improve our teaching so that our children can be the best they can be, and increase the opportunities that they had to learn outside the classroom. As you look through this newsletter, I hope that you can see how hard the staff have worked to make these three things happen, and how well our children have risen to the challenge.

We are regularly answerable to a variety of external people, but our biggest critics are our children. They take part in more lessons than anyone else, and see every different facet of school life, whereas most of us only experience parts of it directly. Our student voice this year has been humbling. They have met with a variety of people to give their independent views, and they have consistently told us that they are happy and feel safe in school, that their learning has improved, their book work has improved, the behaviour in school is much better, and that they have many more opportunities to take part in groups and activities than ever before. I couldn't ask for better feedback from anyone.

So many events and activities have brought our community together over the past year. A whole host of trips to theatres, concerts, to look at art and architecture, to investigate urban environments through photography, and so many more. I won't list them all because it would take far too long and I would inevitably miss someone out!

Mrs. Smalley, our new Head of PE, ably assisted by her team, Mr. Davies and Mr. O'Neill, organised the best sports day that we have had. Every child took part in one way or another, and there were events taking place across several football pitches and the athletics track, over the whole day. The staff relay was worthy of It's a Knockout...

We also held our first ever Ellesmere Parklife Summer fair, organised by Mr. McNamee, Mr Moffat, Mrs. Hilton and Mr. Heaton. What a day that was! Over 400 people attended through the scorching day to watch stadiumworthy performances by over 70 of our really talented musicians. We had performances by bands, soloists, and even a Dad and Daughter duet. These performers were from every year group, and the courage displayed by our children, as well as their talent, was truly breath-taking. I'm sure I wasn't the only one who pretended their eyes were watering because of the breeze...

It isn't just the sporting and musical talents that we need to celebrate though. The academic achievements of our children continue to be something to be very proud of. The library has been full of eager readers all year, stewarded, advised and nurtured by Mr. Campbell, our fantastic librarian, and our English team, headed by Miss Connor. We have twenty students taking the time to study Further Maths as an extra GCSE with Mr. Tunney and our

excellent Maths team, and our students have seen success in a variety of trust-wide competitions in a variety of activities, including Photography, Geography and Debating. Our year 11s showed absolute dedication to their exams this year, attending before and after school revision sessions, and even Science Saturday School, run by Miss Palin and the Science team.

Speaking of Year 11, we are so proud of them, and so sorry to see them go. They left in style though, with a final (tearful) assembly and they were clapped out of the school for the last time by all of our Year 7 children. Their Prom, held for the second time at Manchester United's ground (sorry Blues!), was a fantastic event, with our young adults demonstrating again what well mannered, kind and energetic young people they are. I know every single one of them will have a bright future ahead of them.

Hot on their heels though are our Year 10s, who enter their final year in September. We have recruited a very strong Student Leadership Team in the form of our prefects, and I know that the whole year will excel next summer when they show the same commitment and maturity as this year's leavers.

Of course, none of this would be possible without the support of our outstanding parents and carers. I am so relieved that we are able to have face to face parent's evenings again so that we can have a better dialogue with you about your children's progress. A shining example of your impact is that our Attendance this year as a school has been exemplary. We have consistently been almost 6% above the National Average for attendance, and have some of the highest attendance in Salford. Thank you for helping us help your children by getting them here every day and on time: please don't stop what you are doing!

You have consistently supported us and your children, and challenged us when you have felt that things weren't as good as they could be. I hope that you can see that we have listened and responded by making significant and lasting improvements over the year.

I hope that you and your families have a brilliant summer, and I thank you sincerely for helping us to make our Vibrant, Inclusive and Proud community ever stronger. Here's to an even better 2023!

# <u>A message from Mr Cassidy about Culture day</u>

Thursday 7th July was Culture Day at EPHS. This wonderful celebration of cultural heritage and diversity was the idea of some of our students. It began just a couple of weeks earlier when Asvini and Dylan from Year 9 showed amazing public-speaking skills to present the idea to all staff in the auditorium. Their first idea was for students to be allowed, for one day, to come to school wearing clothes that represented their own cultural heritage. They also wanted staff to prepare lessons for Culture Day which focused on celebrating the amazing cultural diversity we have here at EPHS.

Culture Day began with a 'guess the teacher' quiz in form time, celebrating the cultural diversity among our staff. During Period 1, all of Year 7, 8 and 9 listened to our fantastic guest-speaker, Nathaniel Tetteh. Nathaniel is a local councillor, British-Ghanaian, and a former student at this school. He delivered a really inspirational talk on how his own cultural background has driven him on to be successful, and how the students of EPHS should embrace all the opportunities that cultural diversity brings.

Over the course of the day, students were involved in a huge variety of activities celebrating different cultures, learning sign language, learning to count in Mandarin Chinese in MFL lessons, participating in the Great Big Culture Quiz in Geography, cricket taster lessons in PE, studying Native American and Aztec Art (in Art), learning about the 'hidden figures' of Computer Science who have not received the credit they deserved due to their cultural background, learning about scriptwriting and stereotypes of northern working-class culture in English, learning to count in Irish, and sampling different types of bread from around the world and assessing what makes each one different, to name a few!

Among the highlights of the day were the amazing performance by Mr McNamee's classes performing Samba music, a mixed group of Y7-9 students producing food from all corners of Asia with Mrs McNally in Food Tech, and the amazing five hours of Bollywood dance classes led by Mrs Kaur and two of our Year 11 students!

"It was really good that everyone got to show what their culture is all about. People got to show their cultural background and be proud of it and talk about it. We should do it next year too so that the new Year 7s get to experience it and show their cultural heritage"— Nishaan, Year 8.




# Young Geographer of the Year competition

The judges said "*Just brilliant, the level of detail is fantastic! The use of photos and images really adds to the work, well done!"*.


