General School Reminders

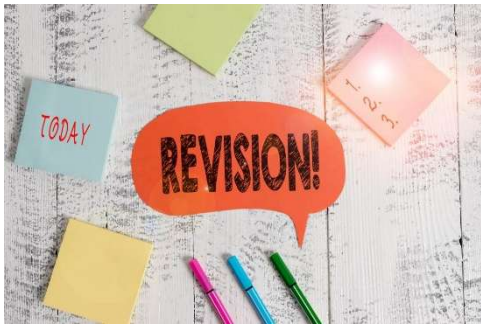


Uniform

Work Experience is taking place for 5 days - Monday 13th - Friday 17th July 2026.

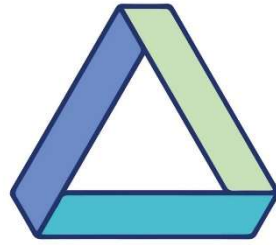

Year 10 Pupil James Shines in Pink Kangaroo Maths Challenge

Congratulations to James, a talented year 10 pupil, who has achieved outstanding success in this year's Pink Kangaroo Maths Challenge, earning recognition for exceptional problem-solving skills and mathematical ability.

The Pink Kangaroo is an elite follow-on round of the UK Mathematics Trust competitions, reserved for high-performing students who demonstrate strong logical thinking and creativity. Competing against some of the brightest young mathematicians in the country, James rose to the challenge with confidence and determination. He achieved a Gold Award in the Intermediate Maths Challenge and a Bronze Award in the Pink Kangaroo Maths Challenge. With this success, James has not only brought pride to our school but also set a strong example of what can be achieved through hard work and enthusiasm for learning.

His achievement reflects not only a deep understanding of mathematical concepts but also the perseverance required to tackle complex and unfamiliar problems.
