Blackpool Trip Competition



For each week between **11th May and 3rd July**, if your child achieves 100% attendance, they will receive an Attendance Ticket. If your child achieves 100% attendance for the whole of this period they will receive a maximum of 7 Attendance Tickets.

On **3rd July**, all Attendance Tickets will go into a draw for a place on a trip to Blackpool Pleasure beach towards the end of the school year. A total of 30 places will be drawn and each student will be able to choose a friend to join them (however their attendance must be a minimum of 90% at the time of the draw). This means a total of 60 students will be able to attend this trip.

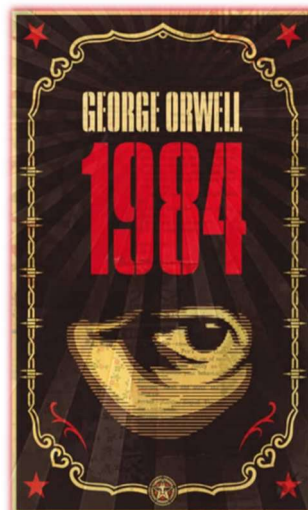

Work Experience Message - Year 10

Monday 13th - Friday 17th July - WORK EXPERIENCE - The deadline for confirming work experience has now passed and all placements should have now been added to [Morrisby](https://www.morrisby.com/) (<https://www.morrisby.com/>). Thank you kindly to all the parents and employers that have supported work experience and helped the students secure a placement.

For placements to proceed, we must have received completed forms from employers (stage 2) and parental consent (stage 3). Confirmed Morrisby placements will show 4 completed green stages as below:

Step 4 - Coordinator confirmation

- This placement is fully approved and will go ahead as planned.
- The student and employer have received a confirmation email.

Please can we ask all students to check their placements on Morrisby and contact employers if any information is missing. Students can view all their placement details - e.g. employer details, contacts etc - on Morrisby, using their school email addresses (ephforename.surname@consilium-at.com) and the passwords they have created - most students used the same passwords they have for school emails!

We also ask that students **"reach out"** to their employers as a thank you for offering the placement ahead of them attending. This could be a phone call or email and is also an opportunity for any final queries on the placement (e.g dress code, timings, lunch arrangements etc if unsure!).

If a student is unsure of their Morrisby details, please can they speak to Miss Farooq (Business & Engagement Lead), Mr Farmer (Careers Adviser), Mrs Lewis (Head of Year) or Miss Parkinson (Assistant Principal) in school.

A reminder that any students **without** a work placement confirmed (stage 4) on Morrisby will be expected in school as usual on 13017 July.

Important safety message from Salford City Council

As the school holidays approach, please make sure you and your children fully understand the dangers of jumping from bridges and swimming in Salford Quays, rivers, lakes, reservoirs and other open water.

Too many young people have already lost their lives; please help us prevent any more tragedies.

Safety facts they may not appreciate:

- The water in the Quays, rivers, lakes etc is cold even on the hottest days
- Jumping from any height into cold water sends the body into automatic shock causing people to gasp. Even the best swimmer will be affected.
- When you gasp you run the risk of taking water into your lungs and drowning; if you jump from a bridge you plunge deeper and increase the risk.
- There may also be hidden hazards which could prevent you from resurfacing
- If you swim outside an organised session with lifeguards you are relying on your family/friends/members of the public to save you if you get into difficulties
- Because of all these dangers there is a Public Spaces Protection Order in place which makes it against the law to jump from bridges and/or swim in Salford Quays except during organised swimming sessions with lifeguards.
- Organised swimming sessions have a safe ratio of lifeguards to swimmers.
- The bridges are monitored by CCTV and regular joint council/police safety patrols walk the area. They will advise young people of the dangers but if they choose to ignore that advice and are identified as jumping from any bridge they will be sent a warning letter with a home visit from the police.
- In previous years, several young people aged under 18 received a warning letter and home visit from the police. A number of adults received £100 fixed penalty notices for breaching the Public Spaces Protection Order.



The Quays is a wonderful area to visit and enjoy but we don't want that visit to end in tragedy.

It is also important to remember that many people call the Quays home and anti-social behaviour and littering is just as upsetting for them as for people in other areas of our city. It costs nothing to be kind and thoughtful; please help us so everyone stays safe and enjoys their summer at the Quays.
