Extremely high prevalence of COVID-19 and existing measures have failed to reduce community transmission		<ul> <li>High-quality face-to-face education remains a government priority.</li> <li>Attendance restrictions should only ever be considered as a short-term measure and as a last resort for individual settings, on public health advice in extreme cases where other recommended measures have not broken chains of in-setting transmission or across an area, on government advice in order to suppress or manage a dangerous variant and to prevent unsustainable pressure on the NHS.</li> <li>In all circumstances, priority should continue to be given to vulnerable children and young people and children of critical workers to attend to their normal timetables.</li> <li>Where measures include attendance restrictions, DfE may advise on any other groups that should be prioritised.
